For Closing Assemblies and Festivals it works well to choose a "School Closing Song" that is sung at the end of every event (it can even be sung at the end of every day) so that the children have a deep visceral reaction to it and move to a quiet close. We recommend either Gone to Bed, Lovely Evening, or Music Alone Shall Stay. All of these can be found in the "Community Sing" section, and all can be sung as a straight melody or done as rounds.
